Learn to Ride Cycle Training Facility in Tuggeranong

The Learn to Ride cycle training facility in Tuggeranong is now open for young cyclists to practice their riding skills and learn about road safety.

Minister for Justice, Consumer Affairs and Road Safety, Shane Rattenbury, opened the first of two Learn to Ride centres being constructed by the ACT Government. The Learn to Ride centre located at Greenway Park in Tuggeranong provides a practical facility for parents, schools and community groups to train children learning to ride a bike.

The centre has the look and feel of a real road environment and is a safe space for young cyclists to learn riding skills. The centre incorporates everything you would expect to see out in our suburbs, including footpaths, roundabouts, pedestrian crossings, line markings and road signs.

The centre is intended for children from preschool to year four and is suitable for broad ranging skills and needs, including children with additional needs. The facility will also be used by the Cyclabilities pilot program which helps children with additional needs develop cycling skills and learn about road safety awareness.

A second Learn to Ride centre will be constructed at Lake Ginninderra in Belconnen, which is expected to open later this year.
