The Professional Standards Council serves the ACT community by protecting consumers and facilitating the improvement of occupational standards across the Territory. The Council is responsible for assessing and approving applications for Professional Standards Schemes which limit the civil liability of occupational association members.

Expressions of interest are sought from all areas of the community, including the private, government and community sectors. Women, people with disabilities and people of indigenous and culturally diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

This position will be appointed for an initial term of up to 3 years.

Remuneration:

Remuneration is set by the Professional Standards Authority. Members receive \$370 per four-hour meeting and \$77 per hour thereafter. The Professional Standards Authority remunerates travel and accommodation expenses for members to participate in bi-monthly meetings in Sydney, New South Wales.
