The Attorney-General of the Australian Capital Territory, Gordon Ramsay MLA, invites expressions of interest from eligible and suitably qualified people for appointment as the ACT Director of Public Prosecutions from 1 January 2019.

Expressions of interest are sought from all areas of the legal community, including the private, government and community sectors. Women, people with disabilities and people of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and culturally diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

The ACT Director of Public Prosecutions is responsible for prosecuting criminal offences in the name of the Crown. The Director's functions are set out in section 6 of the [Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1990](#).

Eligibility

The ACT Director of Public Prosecutions is appointed by the ACT Executive. The position will be appointed for an initial term of up to seven years.
