ACT Privacy Law

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The [Information Privacy Act 2014](#) applies to the handling of personal information by the ACT Government and public sector agencies.

This law sets out 11 Territory Privacy Principles (TPPs) that regulate the handling of personal information by the ACT Government and public sector agencies.

All ACT public sector agencies are required to have a Territory privacy policy that explains clearly how they will collect, use and disclose and store personal information, how you can access and correct your personal information and how you can make a privacy complaint.

The Information Privacy ACT is administered on behalf of the ACT by the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC). That office is responsible for handling privacy complaints where an individual believes that an ACT public sector agency has interfered with their privacy by breaching a Territory Privacy Principle.
