The [Legal Profession Act 2006](#) and Regulations gives the Society general powers to regulate the legal profession in the ACT. These powers are exercised in consultation with, or with the approval of, the Attorney-General. The Act is based on a national Model Law that aims to standardise the regulation of the Australian legal profession.

- Represent, advance, and defend the interests of an independent legal profession in the ACT.
- Protect the public interest in the ACT system of justice through the efficient regulation of the profession in accordance with the Legal Profession Act and the Society's Rules for Solicitors.
